Sod Removal Options

- One-time application of herbicide (Roundup) OR
- Mechanical removal with a sod cutter OR
- Smother it with plastic OR
- Cardboard
 - 1. Mow the area very low and scalp the area.
 - 2. Plant the plants.
 - 3. Place the cardboard around the plants and throughout the area, overlapping generously.
 - 4. Cover the cardboard with mulch (fallen leaves and pine needles recommended). As the cardboard decomposes, it kills the grass and enriches the soil. No need to remove the cardboard.
 - Ramboard is cardboard in a convenient roll, available at Lowes and
 Home Depot. Other brands are inferior. The 50' rolls are easy to handle.
 - b. Boxes of brown cardboard are also useful when you break them down into single thickness and remove tape and staples.
 - c. Pine needles are available in lightweight bales from Lowes and Home Depot.
